# **Tenth Annual Penny Drive: Tons of Fun!**

The 10th Annual Every Penny Counts Day coin collection festival took place on December 1st, World AIDS Day, at Justin Herman Plaza. With the help of over 40 schools and businesses,

AEF raised over \$50,000 from Penny Jars during the month of November.

Our top business was (and has been for several years) the Skywalkers team at Industrial

Light and Magic/LucasFilm. With Paul Hill and Eddie Pasquarello as their brilliant

leaders, the team hosted a company-wide spelling bee for the second year in a row, raising more than they did in their first year! The raucous event included several head shavings and musical performances as well. The Skywalkers came in with a total this year of \$22,766.92!

This year the top performing high school was, once again, Head Royce High School in Oakland with

\$4,087.52. Santa Rosa High School more than tripled their effort from past years and finished a close second with \$2,451.92! Our top performing area middle schools were Ralston Middle School in Belmont, with \$2,666.73, **Presidio Middle School**, with \$1,719.96, and **Santa Rosa Middle School**, with \$1,492.34.

And last, but certainly not least, our youngest Pennies Day participants together raised over \$3,400! Our fourteen participating elementary schools raised an average of \$250 each with **Clarendon Elementary School** topping the list with a total of \$653.77. The Harvey Milk Civil Rights Academy, Miraloma Elementary and Gordon Lau Elementary all closely followed with totals of \$494.32, \$467.21 and \$409.16 respectively.

# **Neighbors Dine Out for AEF and BCEF**

On Wednesday, November 10, 2004, thousands of neighbors and friends in the Castro and Noe Valley poured into local restaurants to help support our clients with

AIDS and breast cancer by participating in Dine Around: Castro & Noe Valley. The following week on Wednesday, November 17, the event was repeated and expanded to include other neighborhoods in Dine Around: SoMa & Mission. Thirty-six participating restaurants donated 25 percent of their total daily food and beverage revenue

to AIDS Emergency Fund and Breast Cancer Emergency Fund. A total of \$25,000 was raised from the events, including \$5,200 from patrons who chose to make an additional donation to AEF/BCEF those nights

With volunteer support from the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence and the Castro Lions Club and promotional assistance from the Merchants of Upper Market and Castro, Eureka Valley Promotion Association, Noe Valley Merchants and Professional Association and South of Market Merchants Association, AEF/BCEF's Dine Around was one of the largest neighborhood-based fundraisers of the year.

"Once again, the event proved to be a huge success," said Chris Morris, Events and Fundraising Manager of AEF/BCEF. "We filled nearly every restaurant, and patrons had a good time while raising funds for our clients. Next year we hope to expand the event further to include more restaurants and neighborhoods."

The neighborhood-based Dine Around event started last year with much success in the Castro and Noe Valley. With its continuing success with Dine Around, AEF/BCEF is exploring the idea of expanding Dine Around to other neighborhoods in 2005.
