
This year's award honorees included the Edge


#### 04.23.06 THE FORTUNE TELLERS BALL

We give all of our clients a satisfaction survey to complete so we can get direct feedback about the job we're doing. One of the questions is: "Are you aware that your client intake is performed by a volunteer?" I'm surprised that most new clients don't know how volunteer-driven the AEF and BCEF are. We here at the office are so grateful for our strong and diverse volunteer base that we forget that people new to The City or to the system don't know our history.

Almost three years ago, one of our volunteers, Tim McElroy, attended a Basket Contest at The Edge Bar. He and his partner had only been in San Francisco a couple of months, and he wasn't all that familiar with AEF. However, the volunteers and Board members who were there facilitating the contest made it clear that AEF is not about bureaucracy — it's about action. It's about fundraising out in the community. And it's about having fun doing it. He started volunteering shortly after that, and is still here.



Tim has led quite an interesting life, bouncing back and forth between corporate life, non-profit organizations,

and his own small business ventures. A native Californian, Tim grew up in Ventura, north of Los Angeles. At the age of 17 he started working, and hasn't stopped since. His career path took him to Los Angeles, Seattle, and then back to Ventura, where he met his current (registered domestic) partner. They got married in a church in Ventura and stayed there for seven years, before his health took a dramatic turn and he suffered two strokes. No longer able to drive a car, Southern California became a less convenient place to live. So he and his partner, who had lived in San Francisco in the past, moved up here together because you don't need a car, the doctors are better, they could get married again, and - hey, it's San Francisco, frevvinsake, and we end up where we started - at a Basket Contest.

This remarkable and varied life is typical of our wonderful volunteer staff, but what is more typical, even, is his attitude. "I truly enjoy meeting and working with the clients. AEF has done so much for me and my fellow brothers and sisters with AIDS. I am proud and honored to volunteer here. The staff is wonderful to work with - truly a work family. I look forward to being here and will be here as long as I'm able."

## Postcards From the Edge

In April 1991, Gary Rahlf, Don McMartin and then-Edge Bar manager Eric Weinmann got together to cook up a fundraiser for AEF. Together they launched the "Edge Basket Contest," a once-a-month event at the Edge Bar offering a cash reward to the winning patron who was willing to get up on stage, answer a few questions and then drop his pants for charity. The first contest featured 18 contestants. Little did Gary, Don, and Eric know that they were launching what would become the single longest running monthly AIDS fundraiser in San Francisco.

After Eric passed away in 2002, Gary continued the Basket Contest tradition, enlisting AEF board members **Steve Logan, Phil Seigel, Dave Jensen, Glennon Sutter, Jeff Braff** and others to help run the event. For at least the last decade, comic **Danny Williams** has

MC'ed most of the contests. Even after moving to Palm Springs, he continued to commute back to SF monthly for the shows. Recent guest MCs have included **TJ Istvan** and **Daddy Mike Ostfeld**.

Miraculously, all these men have kept this tradition alive and profitable for 178 consecutive months, just two contests short of 15 years. But, like a great athlete whose number is retired after a long and outstanding career, all good things must end. The last Edge Basket Contest was held in January. At AEF's recent gala,

the Basket Contest was ceremoniously retired when **Gary Rahlf** pulled the boxer shorts off a symbolic last contestant mannequin to reveal the total amount raised by this unique bar event over 15 years: \$93,142!

Mike Smith & Gary Rahlf expose the 15-year tally of the Edge Basket Contest. In a letter to AEF in March, **Don McMartin**, owner of the Edge Bar, vowed to continue to make a \$500 contribution to AEF each month in memory of Eric Wienmann and the Edge Basket Contest until, in his words, "the Edge or AIDS no longer exists." Thank you to Don, Gary, the hundreds of volunteers and contestants who made the Edge Basket Contest so fun and profitable all these years!
